THE LIBRARY HITS THE OPEN ROAD

Fraser Valley Regional Library introduces Library Live and On Tour.

Abbotsford, BC – What's black, white, orange, green and read all over? It's *Library Live and On Tour*! The community is invited to join Fraser Valley Regional Library (FVRL) as they launch Library Live and On Tour – a trailblazing mobile library service initiative. The April 25 launch party will be hosted in the Abbotsford Visitor Centre parking lot located at 34561 DeLair Road from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

"LiLi will shatter library stereotypes and extend the reach of FVRL beyond our walls and into the community," says Smitty Miller, Tour Manager of Library Live and On Tour. The centerpiece of this initiative is a highly noticeable souped-up 2012 Nissan Cube fondly nicknamed 'LiLi'.

Definitely not a bookmobile – LiLi is a little hotrod with very 'un-library-like' enhancements, including a full-vehicle wrap and undercarriage glow, a permanently mounted 40" plasma digital display screen, external music and public address system, a built-in bookshelf with free new books and a 'gadget bar' complete with tablet computers, eReaders, audiobook technology and laptops.

"Unlike traditional 'bookmobiles,' LiLi will stress services, access to information and awareness, rather than being exclusively about library materials," says Miller. LiLi will focus on connecting with individuals who might not otherwise walk into library buildings, by visiting food banks, shelters, seniors' homes and other community hubs. LiLi will also promote FVRL at festivals, fairs and parades all over the Fraser Valley.



As the first library project of its kind in North America, LiLi has garnered a lot of attention from businesses who have donated services and equipment to help make her more noticeable for her work in the community. "Abbotsford custom car shop 360 Fabrication, Inc. provided the creative concept and installation of the on-board technology; Clarion donated much of the audio equipment; and Abbotsford Nissan donated the mag wheels," says Miller. "These businesses' generosity and innovative edge have helped to make LiLi one-of-a-kind."
